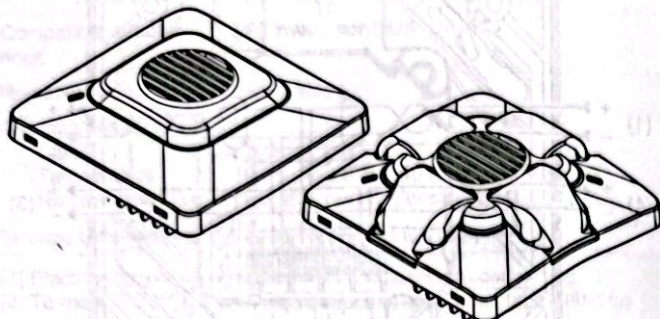




Genesis LED Outdoor Speaker-Strobe Installation Sheet



Description

Genesis LED outdoor speakers and speaker-strobes are wall or ceiling mounted fire alarm notification appliances designed for outdoor wet applications and are suitable for use with 25 or 70 VRMS distributed speaker systems. See Table 1 for a list of models.

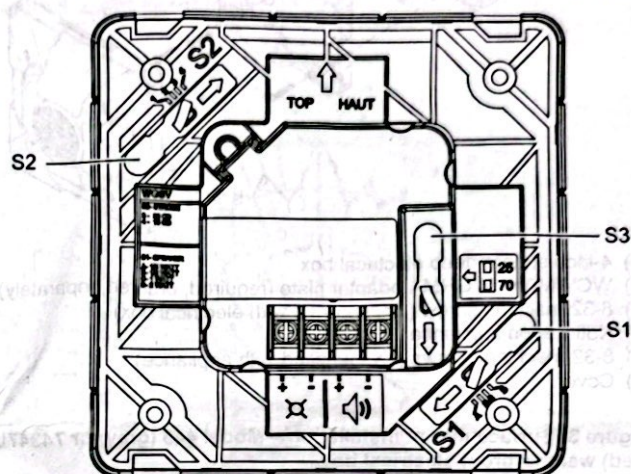
Configuration

Caution: Equipment damage hazard. Configuration switches are protected by a rubber cover that is attached at the end opposite the arrow. Lift the end indicated by the arrow to access the switch underneath. When you lift the cover, be careful not to detach it from the appliance.

1. Select the speaker wattage by lifting the cover on S1, and then sliding the switch to the required setting. See Figure 1.
2. Select the speaker voltage by lifting the cover on S3, and then sliding the switch to the required setting. See Figure 1.
3. On speaker-strobes, select the strobe candela by lifting the cover on S2, and then sliding the switch to the required setting. See Figure 1.

Note: Switch S2 is not available on speaker-only models.

Note: Temporal 3 coding is the required output for fire notification devices per NFPA 72. Any device coding other than temporal 3 is at the discretion and approval of the local authority having jurisdiction (AHJ).

Installation

Install and wire this device in accordance with applicable national and local codes, ordinances, and regulations.

Connect the field wires as shown in Figure 4, and then attach to the wall box as shown in Figure 2 and Figure 3.

When installing the notification appliance on a 4-inch square deep electrical box, remove the trim skirt from the adapter ring by removing the two screws from the back of the adapter ring.

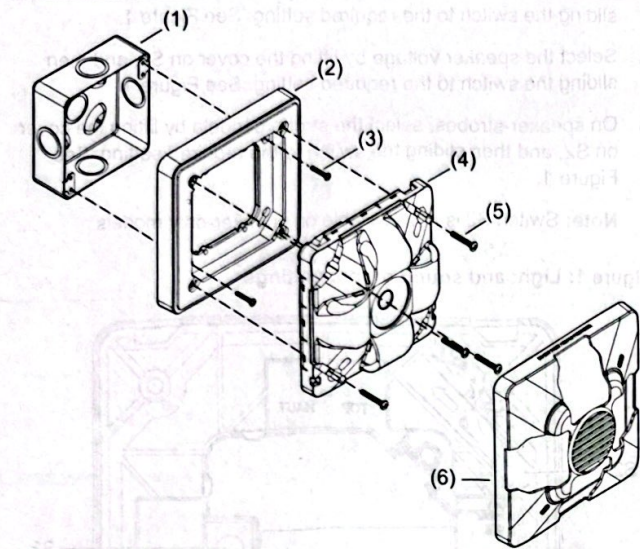
Synchronized operation requires a separately installed synchronization device. See the control unit or power supply compatibility list for compatible synchronization devices.

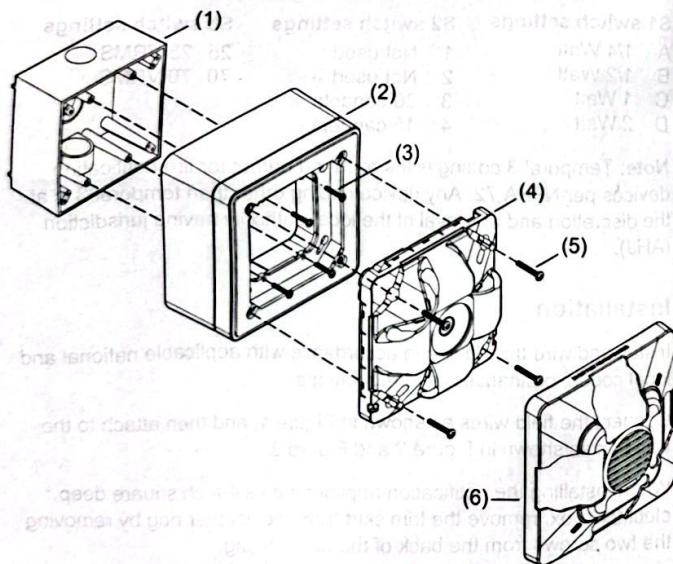
- See "Specifications" below for a list of compatible electrical boxes that meet UL/ULC, IP66, and NEMA 4X requirements.
- To meet IP66 requirements, plumbing tape (Teflon tape) must be applied to all threaded conduit plugs and connectors.

Figure 3: Surface mount installation – Model 449 (gray) or 74347U (red) weatherproof electrical box



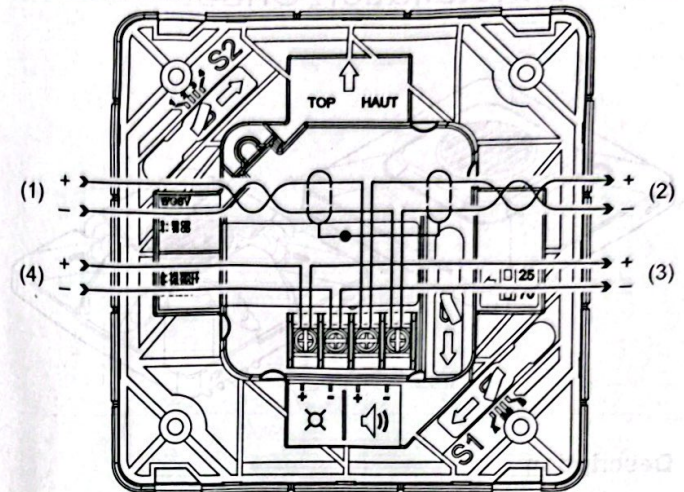
- (1) Model 449 or 74347U weatherproof surface mount box
- (2) WGMA or WGRMA adapter plate with ring (required, ordered separately)
- (3) 6-32 machine screw (4X, supplied with appliance)
- (4) Notification appliance
- (5) 8-32 machine screws (4X, supplied with appliance)
- (6) Cover

Wiring

Wire as shown in Figure 4.

Caution: Electrical supervision requires that you break the wire run at each terminal. Do not loop field wires around the terminals.

- (1) Speaker circuit in (shields, if used, must be continuous and free from earth ground except at the signal source)
- (2) Speaker circuit out
- (3) Strobe circuit out
- (4) Strobe circuit in (signal polarity shown in the active condition)

Maintenance and testing

Caution: Equipment damage hazard. To maintain the required agency listings, do not change factory-applied finishes.

This unit is not serviceable or repairable. Should the unit fail to operate, contact the supplier for replacement.

Perform a visual and operational inspection in accordance with applicable codes and standards or as directed by the local authority having jurisdiction.

Figure 5: Light distribution

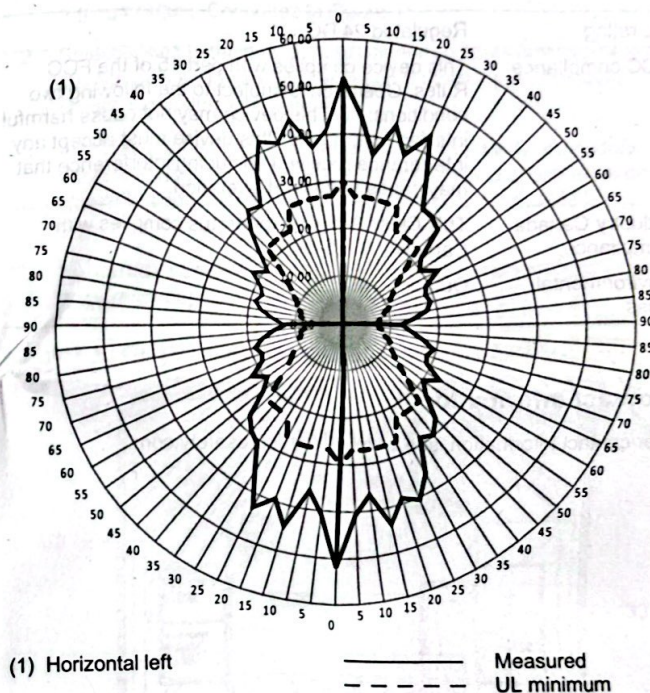
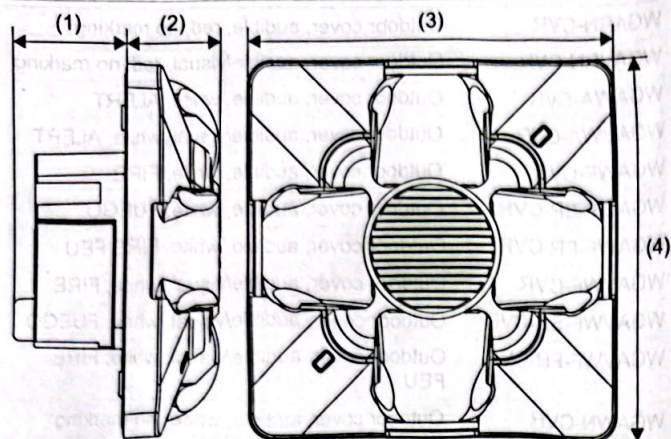


Figure 6: Dimensions
